A Note From Our Lead Pastor

"New year, new me!" Everywhere you turn in January, you hear this sentiment. We see a new year as a blank slate, a canvas on which to paint a new life and experience that we've always desired. And while there is something to be said for new beginnings, the biggest problem with a new year is that you're still the same you. Nothing about the movement of the planet around the sun changes your character, your discipline, or your habits. Now don't get me wrong, change is possible, but it will not happen just because the calendar reads 2025. Instead, we need to learn a new axiom, "If nothing changes, nothing changes." That might sound repetitive but hear me out. If you fail to change your habits, your thoughts, your actions, nothing in your life will change, it will simply remain as it always was. A Note From Our Music and Children's Pastor

WORSHIP MINISTRY

As we wrap up a very busy and successful year, I would like to take some time to remind you about the importance of the worship ministry. Each week the men and women in the worship ministry work hard to honor God and lead His people in worship. If you want to make a difference and impact the whole church, the worship ministry is the place to serve. Here are some words from Mike Harland, former director of Lifeway Worship, about choir and can be applied across the Worship and Music Ministry of the church.

Choirs (instrumental and tech) Emphasize the Whole Group Over the Parts. You can't have a choir with one person. You can't even have a choir with a few people, relatively speaking. Choirs are made up of a group of people, all uniting with the single purpose of singing a particular message together. It requires that each person sacrifice personal interest and pursue the purpose of the whole.

Choirs (instrumental and tech) Demonstrate the Value of Each Person. At the same time choir emphasizes the whole, it also gives value to the individual. Each voice adds a unique part of the sound – a sound that is incomplete when that voice is missing. Though choir produces something greater than any one singer, it also relies on each person doing their part.


I know it is January, but VBS will be here soon so please begin praying how you can serve in this ministry.
