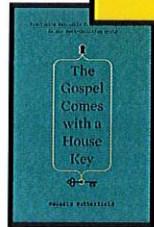

Theology



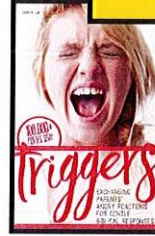
Knowing God's Truth by Jon Nielsen (Cost: \$18)

Hospitality



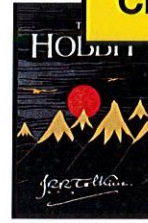
The Gospel Comes with a House Key by Rosaria Butterfield (Cost: \$13)

Parenting



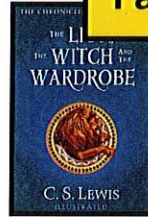
Triggers by Amber Lia and Wendy Speake (Cost: \$15)

Classic Fiction



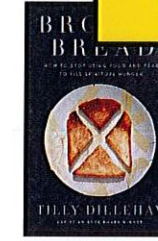
The Hobbit by J. R. R. Tolkien (Cost: \$10)
